MA APCD Release 8.0

- Available **NOW**
- Applicants with approved projects that require updated APCD data (Release 8.0) should submit to CHIA a completed Exhibit B (*Certificate of Continued Need and Compliance*) of the Data Use Agreement. After submitting a completed Exhibit B you will receive an invoice (if applicable) for the requested data. Upon payment of the invoice the order for the data will be placed.
- Release 8.0 includes data on services from January 2014 December 2018 with six months of claim runout (includes paid claims through 6/30/19).
- Will be linkable to Release 7.0 via crosswalk
- Additional information on highlights and enhancements will be presented in future APCD User Workgroups.

Applicants with *approved projects* that require newly available year(s) of Case Mix Data (e.g., FY 19) should submit to CHIA a completed Exhibit B (*Certificate of Continued Need and Compliance*) of the Data Use Agreement. After submitting a completed Exhibit B you will receive an invoice (if applicable) for the requested data. Upon payment of the invoice the order for the data will be placed.



Due to Governor Baker's emergency actions to limit the spread of COVID-19 CHIA's workforce will be remote, for now. This arrangement will limit CHIA's ability to produce and deliver data extracts. At this time it is unknown when CHIA will be able to fulfill data requests but CHIA is exploring alternative data delivery options in order to maintain business as usual. CHIA will continue to do its best to limit the impact of our energy response to data requestors.

During this time, CHIA will continue to accept and review data applications for both Case Mix and All-Payer Claims Database (MA APCD) datasets. Review committees, DRC and DPC, will continue their meetings remotely as necessary.

Due to CHIA's physical office being closed, applications will be accepted without a fee. After receipt of the application, CHIA will issue an invoice which will allow applicants to remit payment online.

If you are a Data User that has a CHIA hard drive in your possession, please keep the hard drive at this time while CHIA's physical office is closed.

APPLICATION REMINDERS

Fee Waiver Request Reminders

- If you're submitting a request for a fee waiver, remember to include the fee remittance form in your application package on IRBNet.
- 2. Remember to submit supporting documentation (if required).
- 3. If you're requesting a financial hardship waiver, remember to submit information detailing your project's financial situation (examples: project budget, grant funding, organizational / departmental funding). Also request to pay a specific price that you reasonably believe you're able to afford to contribute.
- 4. CHIA generally does not offer full financial hardship fee waivers. We expect all applicants to have made an attempt to find funding to cover the full cost of the data fees.
- 5. Fee waiver requests can take some time to process especially financial hardship requests.



USER QUESTIONS


<u>Question</u>: I am having problems trying to distinguish newborns in the medical claims. What is the difference between MA APCD medical claims and the case mix hospital inpatient discharge data (HIDD) in terms of different types of data available on newborns?



<u>Answer:</u> One of the key differences in newborn data available between the HIDD and the MA APCD is that HIDD has a dedicated field for newborn birth weight. The HIDD filing specifications explain that birth weight in grams must be present for discharges:

- If type of admission is 'newborn'
- If type of admission is other than 'newborn' and age is less than 29 days

HIDD also has a newborn age in weeks field. Therefore, newborns can be easily distinguished in HIDD if the birth weight field is populated and the newborn age in weeks is '0'. Massachusetts Department of Public Health submits annual birth data to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). When comparing the calendar year CDC birth data for Massachusetts to the fiscal year newborn data in case mix HIDD (see Figure 1 below), even though one provides calendar year statistics and another fiscal year, the newborn counts are still very close.

<u>Answer (Continued)</u>: While the MA APCD does not have a dedicated field for birth weight, it is possible to determine whether the claim is associated with a newborn by provider's use of <u>diagnosis codes to record birth weight in grams</u> (see Table 1 below) and the use of <u>revenue codes to record hospital room and board nursery level</u> (see Table 2 below). As seen in both the CDC data and the case mix HIDD, the annual birth rate for Massachusetts is in the seventy thousands. In fact, if a simple query is run

filtering on the newborn nursery revenue codes alone by year of service during the pre-Gobeille period (CY2011 to 2015), the MA APCD volume of infants is also in the seventy thousands. This number is slightly higher because non-resident infants cared for at hospitals outside of Massachusetts are also included.



<u>Question</u>: I am including the medical claims and member eligibility files in my application requesting the MA APCD. I am considering adding the product file to my request but wanted to know how complete the NAIC Codes (PR017)are?



National Association of Insurance Commissioners Code

Answer: The NAIC code is the number that the National Association of Insurance Commissioner's (NAIC) assigns to insurance carriers and can be used to lookup more detailed information on the product line of business. The product file in MA APCD release 8.0 has 8,987,978 records submitted for 96 OrgIDs. Sixty of the 96 OrgIDs have NAIC Codes for 3,312,158 records (**37% of the product file records**). The completeness of the NAIC codes in MA APCD release 8.0 in comparison to previous releases of the MA APCD has significantly improved. In MA APCD release 5, the codes were 14% complete, in release 6 (17% complete) and in release 7 (18% complete).

Question: I am interested in using the MA APCD pharmacy data to analyze patterns in the failure of patients to refill prescriptions due to financial barriers to make the co-pay and how coupons and rebates are used to help patients. I understand that the pharmacy claims file has a diagnosis code field. Have any diagnosis codes associated with underdosing been entered into this field or would I also have to apply for the medical claims to get this information?

Underdosing



Answer: At this time, the diagnosis code field in the pharmacy claims file is not well populated and only has a 1% reporting threshold. The pharmacy claims file has 869,524,971 records and only 5,804,922 (0.67%) records contain a diagnosis code. However, the principal diagnosis code field in the medical claims file has a 99% reporting threshold and the first associated diagnosis code has a 70% reporting threshold. Therefore, if you intend to analyze medical conditions associated with therapeutic drugs, you would need to apply for the medical claims data. With regards to the use of underdosing codes, we recently compared the latest release of the MA APCD to the latest release of case mix data to analyze the extent to which new ICD-10-CM codes that did not previously exist in ICD-9-CM had been deployed. ICD-10-CM has 995 new codes for different components of underdosing, none of these codes have been used in the pharmacy claims diagnosis code field. However, they have been used in the both the MA APCD and case mix data. In the case mix data, 117 of the 995 underdosing codes are being used and in the MA APCD medical claims, 147 of the underdosing codes are being used. The specific ICD-10-CM code Z91120 for patient's intentional underdosing of medication regimen due to financial hardship is being used in both the MA APCD medical claims and in CHIA's case mix data.

Question: I understand that the APCD ID code is now available to non-government data applicants. In which MA APCD file is it included and how well populated is it?

<u>Answer:</u> Yes, the APCD ID Code is now available to approved applicants as part of the limited data set. In this field, carriers report the value that describe the member's/subscriber's enrollment into one of the predefined categories. Those categories are as follows:

APCD ID

Value	Description
1	FIG - Fully-Insured Commercial Group Enrollee
2	SIG - Self-Insured Group Enrollee
3	GIC - Group Insurance Commission Enrollee
4	MCO - MassHealth Managed Care Organization Enrollee
5	Supplemental Policy Enrollee
6	ICO - Integrated Care Organization or SCO – Senior Care Option
7	ACO – Accountable Care Organization Enrollee (MassHealth only – unless approved by CHIA)
0	Unknown / Not Applicable

APCD ID Code Categories

The APCD ID Code is included in the medical claims, dental claims, pharmacy claims, and member eligibility files. In all four files, the code has a 100% reporting threshold and is well populated at 99.9%.
