USER QUESTIONS

<u>Question</u>: I have been using the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Wide-ranging Online Data for Epidemiologic Research (CDC Wonder) system to compare death certificate data for inpatient, emergency department, and dead-on-arrival care settings to case mix deaths. It is unclear why the numbers don't exactly match.</u>

<u>Answer:</u> The difference is in part attributable to CDC Wonder death certificate data including deaths of Massachusetts residents who may have died in health care settings outside of Massachusetts. Keep in mind case mix is limited to acute care hospitals in Massachusetts. Also, the death certificate

data includes data after any autopsy may have been performed. This can also affect a difference or change in how the place of death is reported. The results of the autopsy may have determined that the extent of anatomic derangement rendered the patient physiologically unsalvageable even with the best ED resuscitative efforts. In these instances, the place of death on the death certificate would be reported as "dead on arrival" instead of ED death. Also, a decedent who is a Massachusetts resident may have been confirmed by family on the death certificate to be a non-resident. Even with these death certificate attributes, the magnitude of difference between the case mix ED death count and CDC was only 1.4% in 2018, 0.5% in 2019 and 2.1% in 2020 as shown below.

Figure 1. Years 2018 – 2020 CHIA Case Mix Outpatient ED Deaths of Massachusetts Residents




Figure 2. Years 2018 – 2020 CDC Wonder Outpatient ED Deaths of Massachusetts Residents

Question: I am currently using the MA APCD to study newborns and would like to apply for the case mix data. In claims data, I am having problems associating newborns with mothers. Before I apply for case mix data, I would like to know the feasibility and the quality of data for linking newborns to mothers.

<u>Answer</u>: The case mix filing specifications require the mother's social security number be reported on the discharge record for newborns and for infants who are less than 1 year old. **Non-government data users** would have access to this field as an encrypted unique health identification number (UHIN) to link to the mother's UHIN on her discharge record.



The filing specifications also require the mother's medical record number be reported on the newborn's discharge record. Access to this additional encrypted field is limited to **government data users**. To check the completeness of the mother's encrypted UHIN and mother's encrypted medical record number in the inpatient hospital discharge data, all records were filter for all infants age '0' with the birth weight field population. The available of linkage data using encrypted mother's medical record number is higher, 97.1 % in FY2020 versus 58.3% for encrypted mother's UHIN.

Question: I am using both the case mix data and the MA APCD. The case mix data appears to have fewer discharge status coding options than the MA APCD. Why is that?

Answer: The case mix filing specifications provides a full list of 41 coding options to use for Patient Status Coding. The MA APCD filing specifications instruct data submitters to use the National Uniform Billing Committee's Patient Status Coding options which includes approximately 43 coding options. Five years of case mix data patient codes were compared to five years of MA APCD discharge status on the top ten codes used, the main difference was that the code still a patient ranked top in the MA APCD and discharged to hospice – home ranked top in case mix.
