
Baystate Mary Lane Hospital is a non-profit, acute care community hospital. It is among the smallest hospitals in Massachusetts, with 25 staffed beds. Baystate Mary Lane is located in the Pioneer Valley/Franklin region and represents 1% of all acute hospital staffed beds in the region. Baystate Mary Lane is a member of the Baystate Health system, which is the parent company of Health New England health plan.

PATIENTS Forty-eight percent of all inpatient cases treated at Baystate Mary Lane are from Ware and Belchertown.

INPATIENT SERVICES Compared with the other community hospitals, Baystate Mary Lane treats a greater proportion of lower-severity cases. In FY12, it accounted for 1% of all inpatient discharges from acute hospitals within the Pioneer Valley/Franklin region.

FINANCIAL PERFORMANCE Baystate Mary Lane's total revenue in FY12 was \$30 million. Its FY12 public payer mix was 60%, higher than the average community hospital. Baystate Mary Lane's FY12 inpatient cost<sup>‡</sup> per case mix adjusted discharge was \$8,754, approximately 14% lower than the average community hospital. Baystate Mary Lane's CY12 average commercial payer price level was at the 34<sup>th</sup> percentile, the third lowest of all community hospitals. It earned a surplus of \$325,000 (1.1% total margin) in FY12, although it was not profitable in FY10 or FY11.






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





How has the volume of the hospital's outpatient visits changed compared to FY08, and how does this hospital compare to the average hospital in its peer cohort? (FY08=100)


Peer Cohort


How have the hospital's total outpatient costs changed compared to FY08, and how does this hospital compare to the average hospital in its peer cohort? (FY08=100)
